Special statement from the Interim President and Treasurer of FCSal:

Due to the on-going challenges of COVID-19 in the 2020-2021 grant cycle, FCSal and all its board members decided to not give a grant for that season. This is due in part to the uncertainty of covid restrictions in regards to in-person fundraising among other uncertainties in the board members' careers and other transitions.
